ABOUT THE DIRECTOR ANTHONY MARK STOCKARD



Professor Anthony Stockard proudly serves as the director of Virginia's most nationally recognized collegiate theatre program of the last decade and America's #1 Most Nationally Recognized HBCU Theatre program of the last five years, the NSU Theatre Company. Since Professor Stockard's arrival, theatre at NSU has gained historic national recognition and acclaim and has also garnered recordbreaking attendance.

Professor Stockard designed and founded the new B.A. in Drama & Theatre Program here at the university. In 2021 Professor Stockard was named on Black Masks "25 Game Changers in Black Theatre" and in 2022 became the forth recipient in the nation to receive the venerable and respected University Resident Theatre Association's Sustained Excellence in Teaching Award. He was also recently featured in American Theatre magazine for the partnership he forged with Virginia Stage Company. Other honors include Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival for Distinguished Production & Performance Ensemble and Distinguished Performance by an Actor in a Play for the production The Brother's Size. The production beat out more than 1,300 productions that were entered in the festival and involved more than 200,000 students nationwide. He was one of four national Best Male Faculty of the Year award finalists for The HBCU Awards; is an inaugural recipient of Alabama State University's 50 Under 50 and Faculty Senate Excellence in Teaching & Research Awards; is a presidentially appointed NSU Honors College Senior Fellow; is the recipient of the NSU Theatre Company's Outstanding Dedication & Service Award and NSU Student Government Association's Honor & Appreciation Award. Professor Stockard served as writer and producer on the Emmy Award winning documentary short The Historic Attucks Theater: Apollo of the South.

Professor Stockard has directed more than 60 productions for professional and university stages. He holds memberships and affiliations with Stage Directors & Choreographers Society, Actors Equity Association and Screen Actors Guild.

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT KEENAN SCOTT II



Keenan Scott II is a playwright, poet. actor. director, and producer Queens. New York. The youngest of two, Keenan relocated with his family to southern Maryland where he began his iourney at the age of fifteen in the underground SLAM poetry scene of Washington, DC. By the time he was eighteen he was a self published poet performed up and down the east and coast winning various SLAM poetry contests. Scott began working on what is now Thoughts of a Colored Man fifteen years earlier when he was a Frostburg State University student where

received a Bachelor's in Theater Arts with a concentration in Acting. His work has been produced at notable theaters such as *National Black Theater*, *New York Theater Workshop*, *Arena Stage*, *Woolly Mammoth*, and of course on Broadway.

Thoughts of a Colored Man made its World Premiere at Syracuse Stage during their 2019-2020 season and transferred to Baltimore Center Stage to finish its regional run. On October 13, 2021 Thoughts of a Colored Man made its Broadway debut as one of seven plays by Black playwrights during the Fall 2021 season. Keenan's play Thoughts of a Colored Man is Broadway's first show to have black men in the positions of lead actor, playwright, director and lead producer. This landmark piece is a trailblazer for diversity in the Broadway community as it is the first and only production of its kind to examine, expand, and center stage the diverse livelihoods of black men in America with such vulnerability and vibrancy. Constantly innovating and creating, Keenan's other work, Hashtag Me Not, was featured in a benefit for NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc. called #WhileWeBreathe. Scott was chosen to be a part of the 2021 TED Fellow cohort to be among a global community of artists, inventors and scientists. He is also developing an array of projects for television and film, currently working with UCP of NBCUniversal.

Productions entered on the Participating level are eligible for invitation to the KCACTF regional festival and may also be considered for national awards recognizing outstanding achievement in production, design, direction and performance.

Last year more than 1,500 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.
